Applicant Eligibility:

- 1. Must be a female between the ages of 17-25.
- Must be Native American and have proof of tribal enrollment or descendency. (Combine tribal blood quantum but only represent one tribe during competition). (For those without CDIB provide descendency).
- 3. Must never have been married or birthed any children
- 4. Must have a 2.0 GPA for the last semester of school
- 5. Must live within a 25 mile radius of Lawton

Miss Indian Lawton Competition Categories 100 Points Total

Private Interview (30%)

Prior to the competition, contestants will participate in a private interview session with the judges. Each session will last approximately 5 to 10 minutes. Questions will focus on Native American issues, education, and/or current events.

• Essay (15%)

On a separate piece of paper, provide a typed 1-2 page essay. The topic of the essay should focus on this year's pageant theme "Who Should Be Role Models For Native American Youth Today." Relate it to your experience and expectations as a Native American, your family, professional goals, and other aspects you feel are relevant. Remember your essay is part of the competition and will be assessed points by the judges based on content, writing skills (grammar, analytical thinking), clarity, and overall presentation. Please put your name on the right hand corner of the first page.

• Evening Gown (15%)

Contestants will model an evening gown of their choice. Contestants shall provide a description of the attire and significance (i.e. made by a family member, brand, etc.) and the name of her escort on the application.

• Introduction (5%)

Each contestant will be evaluated on her verbal communication skills. After each contestant models her evening gown, she will introduce herself, provide a brief biography, statement of career goals and aspirations, and any other relevant information she wishes to share.

• Traditional or Contemporary Talent (20%)

Contestants will present a traditional talent from their respective tribe(s) or perform a contemporary talent. The talent presentation should be between 3-5 minutes in length. Contestants shall provide a brief description of the talent and significance on the application. Changes of presentations will not be allowed once application has been submitted. Note: Length of presentation may vary depending on number of contestants.

• Traditional Dress (10%)

Contestants will model traditional attire from their respective tribe(s). Contestants shall provide a description of the dress and significance on the application.

• Impromptu Question (5%)

Contestants will randomly select a question and answer it while on stage. The question will focus on Native American issues, education, and/or current events. The contestant may ask to have the question repeated once and will then answer it to the best of her ability.

- 1. As a contestant and potential winner of the Miss Indian Lawton title, we, the Lawton Inter- Tribal Women's League, ask that you read the following guidelines. If you feel that you will not be able to abide by any rule, we ask that you reconsider your status as a contestant.
- 2. Miss Indian Lawton must be a student at a high school or university during her entire reign.
- 3. Miss Indian Lawton shall serve as the Mistress of Ceremony at the pageant for the following year after her reign (this will not be the year she gives her title up).
- 4. The winner of the Miss Indian Lawton Pageant shall serve a term of one year and shall sign a contract.
- 5. Miss Indian Lawton will not be permitted to hold more than one title. If such a situation exists, she shall be required to relinquish one of her titles.
- 6. Miss Indian Lawton is a representative of the Indian people in the Lawton community as an Ambassador of Goodwill and is expected to conduct herself in a manner above reproach in all public places at all times.
- 7. Miss Indian Lawton is expected to uphold her title with respect, honor and dignity. If she is involved in any activity which brings dishonor to the title, she will be asked to explain her actions to the director of the pageant and the Lawton Intertribal Women's League, who will then decide if she can or cannot continue her reign.
- 8. If Miss Indian Lawton is asked by the pageant committee to relinquish her title, she is to return the crown and any other materials associated with the Miss Indian Lawton to the Director of the Pageant. If a monetary award was given, she will be asked to return an amount agreed upon by the Lawton Inter-Tribal Women's League and President.
- 9. In the event that Miss Indian Lawton is asked to relinquish her title, the First Runner Up will assume the responsibilities of Miss Indian Lawton for the remainder of the year.
- 10. In the event there are no contestant applications, Miss Indian Lawton will be selected by the Board and Director of the Pageant and the decision will be final.
- 11. Interviews, press releases and any publicity of the title of Miss Indian Lawton will be given only by the President or the Board of the Lawton Inter-Tribal Women's League
- 12. All decisions made by the Lawton Inter-tribal Women's League and Pageant Director are final.

- 2. Miss Indian Lawton shall serve as the Mistress of Ceremony at the pageant for the following year. (This will not be the year she gives her title up.)
- 3. The winner of the Miss Indian Lawton Pageant shall serve a term of one year and shall sign a contract.
- 4. Miss Indian Lawton will not be permitted to hold more than one title. If such a situation exists, she shall be required to relinquish one of her titles.
- 5. Miss Indian Lawton is a representative of the Indian people in the Lawton community as an Ambassador of Goodwill and is excepted to conduct herself in a manner above reproach in all public places at all times.
- 6. Miss Indian Lawton is expected to uphold her title with respect, honor and dignity. If she is involved in any activity which brings dishonor to the title, she will be asked to explain her actions to the director of the pageant and the Lawton Inter-Tribal Women's League, who will then decide if she can or cannot continue her reign.
- 7. If Miss Indian Lawton is asked by the pageant committee to relinquish her title, she is to return the crown and any other materials associated with the Miss Indian Lawton title to the organization Pageant Director. If a monetary award was given, she will be asked to return an amount agreed upon by the Lawton Inter-Tribal Women's League and Pageant Director.
- 8. In the event that Miss Indian Lawton is asked to relinquish her title, the First Runner Up will assume title and the responsibilities of Miss Indian Lawton for the remainder of the year.
- 9. In the event Miss Indian Lawton becomes pregnant or married during her reign as Miss Indian Lawton she will immediately submit a letter of resignation to the committee stating personal reasons for her resignation.
- 10. No press releases or interviews or any publicity of the title Miss Indian Lawton will be given without the consent of the President or the board of the Lawton Inter-Tribal Women's League.
- 11. All decisions made by the Lawton Inter-Tribal Women's League and Pageant Director are final.
- 12. Any grievances of the current reigning Miss Indian Lawton will be made in writing to the President, Lucinda Poahway, who will present to the board for discussion.

Introduction 5%

A proper introduction sets the presence and image of who you are. Below is a sample to consider that is tailored to a pageant setting. It is important to include the following information in your introduction. **Name, age, tribe, hometown, clan(s), major, goals,** (you may say it in any order you like). Your introduction tells the judges and audience you are and what you are about but it should be concise and to the point. It is very appropriate to speak in your native language or just to greet the audience with a "hello" in your language. Please end with a "thank you" so the audience/MC know when you are done speaking. Your introduction should be no more than three minutes. You will keep this form for a reference. You will be presenting your introduction on stage.

Example : "Hello, I'm Jane Doe, 22 years old, a Comanche from Walters, Oklahoma. (If you are from a clan/bank) (I descend from the band of the Comanche Tribe.) I am a senior at Cameron University majoring in Nursing. I plan to work with the Indian Health Service as a Registered Nurse in the field of Geriatrics because I see a need for more Native American Health professionals helping the elderly. Thank you. Include something on your platform if you choose to have one.		

Talent Presentation 20%

Your talent could include: playing a musical instrument, singing a Tribal or contemporary song, performing a modern or traditional dance, demonstrating sign language to a Native song, telling a story or legend from your tribe, demonstrating a Native art, craft, etc. You can represent only one tribe. It is important to identify from which tribe your traditional talent is derived. Your presentation should be no more than 5 minutes. Please type or print clearly.
